ChatGPT Evaluation: Can It Replace Grammarly and Quillbot Tools?

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ABSTRACT

This study aims to assess the capabilities of ChatGPT in comparison to widely utilized writing assistance tools such as Grammarly and Quillbot. The evaluation involves an examination of ChatGPT's performance across multiple dimensions, encompassing grammar and style correction, plagiarism detection, and overall enhancement of writing quality. Employing a series of tests and comparative analyses, this research investigates the potential suitability of ChatGPT as a viable alternative to Grammarly and Quillbot in supporting writers and enhancing the quality of written content. The outcomes and insights derived from this evaluation offer valuable guidance for individuals and professionals seeking effective writing assistance tools. This article comprehensively reviewed 10 distinct cases of Question (covering aspects like grammar, parts of speech, proofreading, rephrasing, plagiarism detection, citation, audience engagement, writing style, tone (with a focus on optimism), and the creation of a short story complete with a title. This evaluation encompassed an assessment of various artificial intelligence tools, with specific attention given to ChatGPT. The results of this assessment demonstrated enhanced efficiency and effectiveness in achieving desired writing goals, with notable exceptions observed in addressing plagiarism and citation-related issues.

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established writing assistance tools. This assessment delves into the capabilities of ChatGPT, a robust language model developed by OpenAI, to ascertain whether it can serve as an effective replacement for Grammarly Premium as a tool for enhancing writing. (Rasul, T.,2023 ; OpenAI L,2022 ; Firat, M. ,2023 ; Xames, M. D,2023) Through an examination of ChatGPT's performance in crucial areas such as grammar and style improvement, plagiarism detection, and overall writing enhancement, we aim to provide valuable insights into its suitability as an alternative to Grammarly Premium.

As we embark on this evaluation, our goal is to furnish readers with a comprehensive understanding of ChatGPT's strengths and limitations compared to Grammarly (Perkins, 2023),(Meyer et al., 2023). By addressing questions related to accuracy, user-friendliness, and adaptability, our intention is to establish a dependable basis for individuals and professionals in search of the most suitable tool to support their writing endeavors (Adiguzel et al., 2023). The outcomes of this assessment holds the potential to guide the choices of those seeking to enhance their writing skills and efficiently produce high-quality written content(Chen, 2023; Dergaa et al., 2023; Pasteur & Koch, 2023; Dergaa,2023).

4. Results and Discussion

First, the summary of the result in Table 12 displays a comprehensive set of text analysis metrics along with their corresponding values, each representing various aspects of the analyzed text. These metrics offer valuable insights into the composition and characteristics of the text.

1. Sentence Count: The text contains different counts of sentences in each of the ten analyzed sections, ranging from 0 to 7 sentences.

- 2. Words: The word count varies across the sections, ranging from 92 to 156 words.
- 3. Characters (no spaces): The number of characters, excluding spaces, differs significantly among sections, with the highest count at 1037 characters.
- 4. Characters (with spaces): The total character count, including spaces, varies widely across the sections, reaching a maximum of 1192 characters.
- 5. Paragraphs: Section Q1 lacks any specified paragraphs, while sections Q2 and Q3 have four paragraphs each. Section Q10 stands out with a single paragraph.
- 6. Lines: The number of lines in each section ranges from 0 to 13 lines, with variations depending on the content.
- 7. Unique Words: The count of unique words shows fluctuations across the sections, ranging from 30 to 64 unique words.
- 8. Lexical Density: Lexical density, which measures the text's informativeness, demonstrates variations in the percentages across the sections, with section Q10 showing the highest at 85.71%.

Finally, these metrics collectively provide a detailed analysis of the text's structure, length, and linguistic complexity, offering valuable insights for further examination and interpretation.

While ChatGPT showcases impressive language capabilities and provides valuable assistance in many areas of writing, it is clear that it cannot fully replace Grammarly Premium at this stage. Grammarly Premium's dedicated focus on grammar and style correction, coupled with its user-friendly interface, remains unparalleled in the domain of writing assistance tools. It excels in providing precise and context-aware suggestions for improving written content. ChatGPT, on the other hand, demonstrates its strengths in generating creative and coherent text, making it an excellent companion for content generation and brainstorming. However, it lags behind Grammarly Premium in the precision and depth of its grammar and style recommendations. Furthermore, Grammarly Premium's robust plagiarism detection feature is unmatched in ensuring the originality of written work.

In conclusion, while ChatGPT is a remarkable language model with vast potential, it should not be viewed as a direct replacement for Grammarly Premium in its current form. Instead, it can complement Grammarly and other writing assistance tools by offering a different set of capabilities, particularly in content generation and ideation. As Al and language models continue to advance, it is possible that future iterations of ChatGPT may bridge the gap further, but for now, Grammarly Premium remains the preferred choice for meticulous grammar and style correction. The choice between the two ultimately depends on the specific needs and priorities of the user, with each tool offering distinct advantages in the world of written communication.
